#### Workers exposed to fall hazards at Bloomfield, New Jersey, construction site

STIRLING, N.J. – Concrete and masonry company Concrete Systems Inc. has been cited for one repeat and seven serious safety hazards following a February investigation conducted by the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration. OSHA investigators opened the inspection after observing workers constructing formwork without fall protection at the construction site of three midrise buildings at 300 Glenwood Ave. in Bloomfield, New Jersey. The investigation was also initiated as part of the agency's local emphasis program\* on fall hazards in construction. The proposed penalties for these violations total \$52,470.

"Concrete Systems Inc. was previously cited twice for exposing workers to fall and other safety and health hazards at work sites in Kearny and Cranford, New Jersey," said Kris Hoffman, director of OSHA's Parsippany Area Office. "Falls are the leading cause of death in the construction industry. It is imperative that this company immediately implement an effective fall protection program to ensure the safety of its employees."

The repeat hazard, with a \$13,860 penalty, was cited because employees were exposed to a 25-foot fall hazard without the proper protection. The company was previously cited for the same violation in 2012. A repeat violation exists when an employer previously has been cited for the same or a similar violation of a standard, regulation, rule or order at any other facility in federal enforcement states within the last five years.

The serious violations, carrying a \$38,610 penalty, were cited almost entirely for violations of fall safety standards. Employees were exposed to fall hazards of up to 25 feet while accessing scaffold platforms without using a ladder. Employees were exposed to fall hazards in excess of 16 feet or 25 feet without the proper fall protection while working from scaffolding. In addition, the company failed to ensure employees were properly tied off on boom lifts and to adequate anchorage points. Concrete Systems also failed to properly train workers on the use of fall protection equipment.

Employees were also exposed to impalement hazards due to rebar ends that were not properly guarded. A serious citation is issued when there is substantial probability that death or serious physical harm could result from a hazard about which the employer knew or should have known.

OSHA has created a Stop Falls Web page with detailed information in English and Spanish on fall protection standards. The page offers fact sheets, posters and videos that vividly illustrate various fall hazards and appropriate preventive measures.

Concrete Systems, based in Stirling, has 15 business days from receipt of the citations to comply, ask for an informal conference with OSHA's area director, or contest the citations and proposed penalties before the independent Occupational Safety & Health Review Commission.

To ask questions; obtain compliance assistance; file a complaint; or report workplace hospitalizations, fatalities or situations posing imminent danger to workers, the public should call OSHA's toll-free hotline at 800-321-OSHA (6742) or the agency's Parsippany Area Office at 973-263-1003.

# Company facing \$52K fines for alleged safety violations during Bloomfield construction

**BLOOMFIELD** — A New Jersey concrete and masonry company is facing a \$52,470 fine after allegedly having employees work in a hazardous environment without the proper protection, the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration announced today.

Workers from Concrete Systems, Inc. were allegedly observed violating safety rules while working on three midrise buildings being constructed at 300 Glenwood Ave. in Bloomfield in February, prompting a state investigation, OSHA officials said.

The Stirling-based company received one repeat citation and seven "serious safety hazard" violations from work done on the job in Bloomfield, officials said.

The company allegedly violated fall safety standards by having employees access scaffold platforms without using a ladder, failing to ensure that employees were properly tied to anchorage points when working more than 25 feet in the air, exposing workers to impalement hazards, and failing to train them on how to use fall protection equipment, OSHA said.

"A serious citation is issued when there is substantial probability that death or serious physical harm could result from a hazard about which the employer knew or should have known," officials explained.

"Concrete Systems Inc. was previously cited twice for exposing workers to fall and other safety and health hazards at work sites in Kearny and Cranford," leading to the one repeat citation, Kris Hoffman, director of OSHA's Parsippany Area Office, said.

"Falls are the leading cause of death in the construction industry. It is imperative that this company immediately implement an effective fall protection program to ensure the safety of its employees."

According to Joseph Rufolo of JW Rufolo and Associates, a safety consultant working with the company, Concrete Systems is contesting the accusations.

"We don't believe that the citations are valid or fair," Rufolo, who has been working with the company for at least four years, said.

"Concrete Systems is a very good, very safety-conscious company. They probably had 40 or 50 workers on the job site [the day] OSHA came in, and all of them were provided with fall safety protection."

Rufolo said OSHA representatives observed employees choosing to walk on equipment instead of provided ladders, and employees not hooking up properly to safety equipment, but that it was provided on the job site.

"Of course it was wrong of those guys not to follow the proper procedures, but when you have 40 other guys using ladders and doing the right thing, we feel it's not air for Concrete Systems to be cited," he said.

"We believe what [OSHA] observed was employee misconduct."

Rufolo said the company is currently contesting the violation charges, and plans to either settle with OSHA or bring the issue to a trial.

300 Glenwood Ave. is the site of an apartment and retail redevelopment project that is currently under construction and set to open next year.

Township officials said Bloomfield is working on standards that should avoid citations on future construction work.

"With the administration's increased focus on redevelopment, Mayor Michael Venezia and members of the council have been working on new responsible bidder guidelines that address workplace safety and education among other important issues," Bloomfield spokesman Keith Furlong said.

"The new guidelines are scheduled to be heard by the council at the next public meeting and if approved implemented shortly thereafter. It is the mayor's hope that the new responsible bidder guidelines will improve worker safety."

Rufolo said Concrete Systems is still working on the cited construction project.

US Labor Department's OSHA fines two companies \$130,500 for trenching hazards at Kearny, NJ, site

KEARNY, N.J. - VM Construction Inc., based in Miami, and Concrete Systems Inc., based in Sterling, were cited by the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Safety and Health Administration for willful and repeat trenching hazards found at a Kearny work site. OSHA's November 2012 investigation was prompted by an imminent danger complaint that alleged workers operated in an unprotected excavation 8 feet deep.

One willful violation, carrying a \$28,000 penalty, was cited against VM Construction Inc. for those workers operating in an unprotected excavation. A willful violation is one committed with intentional, knowing or voluntary disregard for the law's requirements, or with plain indifference to worker safety and health. The construction company was also cited for one serious violation, with a \$2,400 penalty, for failing to ensure a competent person inspected the excavation prior to allowing workers to enter. A serious violation occurs when there is substantial probability that death or serious physical harm could result from a hazard about which the employer knew or should have known.

Concrete Systems Inc., a concrete and masonry contractor, faces \$100,100 in penalties for two repeat violations involving workers operating in an unprotected excavation and entering an excavation that was not inspected beforehand by a competent person. A repeat violation is issued when an employer previously has been cited for the same or a similar violation of a standard, regulation, rule or order at any other facility in federal enforcement states within the last five years. Similar violations were cited in 2008.

"Improperly protected trenches can collapse suddenly and with great force," said Kris Hoffman, director of OSHA's Parsippany Area Office. "OSHA implemented a trenching and excavation special emphasis program in the 1980s, so the industry is well aware of the safety regulations for trenching operations."
